NOTES: *In 1252 the Territory of Provence passed from German and Italian influence to that of France when Count Charles I of Anjou married Beatrice, heiress of Provence. He moved to Marseille and brought with him his own vicar to replace the podestat. The city was permitted to retain its existing statutes provided they be recorded and mutually agreed to. In 1265, 13 years later, this manuscript was copied by a notary from earlier versions worked on during the interim. Significant additions continued to be made in later hands, the last in 1317.* SUMMARY: *Composed of 3 distinct parts, the Statuta Antiqua, the Capitula Pacis (the peace treaties between Charles d'Anjou and the City of Marseilles), and the Statuta Facta Post Pacem, the statutes embrace every aspect of life in the Middle Ages. A partial list of topics include city government, courts and their operation, duties of city officials, regulation of commerce, treatment of foreigners, the public morality, import lists, and taxes. NOTES: *Antonio Vespucci (1449-1534) was the brother of the famous explorer, Amerigo Vespucci. Both were sons of Anastasio and grandsons of another Amerigo. Both probably studied (Amerigo certainly did) under their uncle Giorgio Antonio, whose pupils also included Lorenzo de' Medici. SUMMARY: The document treats the disposition of property confiscated from the conspirators who rose up in the power struggle in April 1478, in which the Pazzi family and a few allies attacked Giuliano and Lorenzo de' Medici in the church of Santa Maria del Fiore. Giuliano was killed, Lorenzo slightly wounded, and as a result, most members of the Pazzi family were executed or, at best, exiled, and their properties confiscated. However, one prominent member of the Pazzi, Guglielmo, son of Antonio, remained loyal to the Medici and subsequently amassed great wealth. In this official act, the procurators and syndics of the Florentine Commune appointed to dispose of the property, sold certain pieces to various citizens (including members of the Frescobaldi and Cavalcanti families), for the account of Guglielmo d'Antonio. Many copies were executed by the finest artists of the period and were viewed among the rich as status symbols. SUMMARY: Included are the following parts: Calendar, Hours of the Cross, Hours of the Holy Ghost, Hours of the Virgin, Office of the Dead, Penitential Psalms, Lessons from the Four Gospels, Litany of the Saints, and Diverse prayers. There are five miniatures and twenty large initials done in the Franco-Flemish style which followed the school of the brothers Van Eyck; the illumination also shows the influence of the School of Fouquet. NOTES: *Advocate to the parliament of Burgundy, historian, and compiler of customary law, Durand was a respected legal scholar during his lifetime and after. There is internal evidence to attribute this manuscript to him but no clear signature. A dialogue is copied between "Durand" and "Bernard," the latter probably being Etienne Bernard, mayor of Dijon in 1594.*
SUMMARY: *Ciceronian dialogue and thesis provide the structure of this essay on the killing of tyrants, a subject much discussed following the events of the reign of Henry III and the Catholic-Protestant schism. SUMMARY: This copy is of particular interest on account of the family financial records (17th century) of the Harbords who originally owned the manuscript and which are to be found in the front and back of the volume. These records give values of commodities, rents, land holdings, wages of servants, labourers, etc. Also because the Harbords lived near Stratford-on-Avon and because one of the receipts is to a William Shakespeare, it is remotely possible that this was the copy Shakespeare used when writing Henry VIII.
